Greetings!

Some of you may know already, but Paul got a burn on his chest and right arm. It happened in the morning, when I set my coffee down to get Paul off of the study desk. He has now learned to get up into chairs by himself. I set him down and was straightening the papers he'd moved around, when I looked over my shoulder to see him grab the cup of hot coffee and spilling it on himself. He immediately started screaming and I took him to the tub to run water over him and cool the burn. It didn't take long for Joanna and me to notice that his skin was coming off. The ambulance came and took Joanna and Paul, and the burn clinic kept him there for a few days. I talked with the doctor who worked in the emergency room, and he said Paul had between 1st and 2nd degree burns. Space on this letter doesn't provide adequate room to tell of all the things that God worked out during this time. We are very thankful for the Lord's mercies and the prayers of the saints. Twice we were told in the hospital that Paul was healing unusually fast. A missionary family, whose son had gone through a similar scenario earlier in his life, mailed Paul a get-well card and some toys. Paul is home and bandage-free. Joanna puts ointment on his chest daily to help the tissue heal. Yuroslav, a saved Ukrainian who attends the church, called me two weeks before the incident and told me he's interested in going to visit people in hospitals, centers, etc. I asked the doctor if we might be able to come and visit people, and she said, "Maybe.", so we'll see.

On other matters, our registration went through successfully—we shouldn't have to re-register until early next year. Gospel tracts are still being taken pretty well around the area we live in. There have been some good days of tract-passing in the market place nearby because of good weather and frequent passers-by. We are going to try and start working with the youth in the church soon. (We would have somewhat already, had we not been sick.) We, as a family, have been sick off and on for the last month and a half; it's been very unusual.

We are close to being able to get a vehicle soon—I think within a month or so. This will be helpful as we start to do more evangelism and ministering. We are very thankful for that...I thought it might take a lot longer.

Please pray about the following: a possible meeting in a village in the middle of April (good weather would help); souls to be saved; our Russian language studies
